What is Good Evaluation?

Governing Boards have a responsibility for supporting school leaders, and one way is to ensure good evaluations. Below is a list of qualities of good evaluations:

1. Good evaluations are fair.

- a. Leaders know BEFORE the school year begins how they will be evaluated and are given a preview of the instrument.
- b. Evaluations are determined based on both qualitative and quantitative data obtained from a variety of sources (observations, reports, surveys, etc.)
- c. Evaluation forms use straightforward language and clearly express levels of competency (simple rating scale)
- d. Evaluation results are communicated with the school leader:
 - i. In a timely manner
 - ii. In an honest and direct manner
 - iii. In person

2. Good evaluations measure key elements that determine successful educational leadership such as:

- a. Parent Involvement and Community Partnerships
- b. Student-Centered Learning Climate
- c. Professional Development and Human Resource Management
- d. Instructional Leadership: Improving Teaching and Learning
- e. School Management and Daily Operations
- f. Financial Management
- g. Plant Management
- h. Communication and Interpersonal Skills

3. Good evaluations support school leader performance

- a. Areas of strength used to motivate and validate
- b. Areas of weakness used to develop professional development goals and plans
- 4. Good evaluations improve communication between the school leader and the board
- 5. Good evaluation helps the board better understand the school leader's job
- 6. Good evaluation is a year-round activity, not an end-of-the-year "gotcha" or letter of praise
